**Continuing Education Opportunities
at Cool Plants, Hot Topics!**

The end of the year is fast approaching. Do you have all the continuing education hours you need for recertification? **Join us for the 2022 Master Gardener Plant Sale and Talks at Bellevue Botanical Garden on Sunday, September 11, 2022, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.** You can earn Continuing Education hours at two lectures and purchase plants from a variety of vendors. An additional plant sale at the event will support the Master Gardener Foundation of King County. It will include nursery plants and plants donated by Master Gardeners and demonstration gardens.

The Living Soil, 10:00 a.m. – 11:30 a.m.: Science writer and public speaker, Anne Biklé, lectures about the soil microbiome. She'll cover methods and techniques for cultivating and safeguarding beneficial soil life. Drawing from her books, *The Hidden Half of Nature* and *What Your Food Ate*, Anne will share how gardeners can bring their soil back to life and keep it that way. A book signing will follow the lecture. Copies of Anne's books –*What Your Food Ate*, *The Hidden Half of Nature* and her husband, David R. Montgomery's book, *Growing a Revolution* – will be available for sale and signing at the event.

Summer Lawn Recovery Using Natural Lawn Care, 1:30 p.m. – 3:00 p.m.: Ladd Smith, co-owner of In Harmony Sustainable Landscapes, lectures about the five steps of Natural Lawn Care based on the Natural Yard Care Program. Fall is the best season for lawn renovations and preparing your lawn for winter. Learn how to revive your lawn after the stress of summer heat. 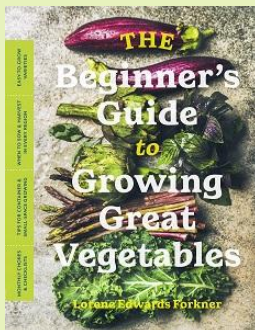
